With a history dating back to 1514, Trinity House provides aids to navigation around the coast of England and Wales, the Channel Islands and Gibraltar – some of the busiest shipping lanes in the world. Trinity House deploys a total of some 600 aids to navigation, including lighthouses, light vessels, buoys, beacons and a satellite navigation service as well as pilotage and the marking/dispersing of dangerous wrecks. It is also responsible for auditing and inspection of a further 10,000 aids to navigation provided by local port and harbour authorities and those provided on offshore structures and wind farms.

Founded in 1954, Tideland Signal Corporation is committed to meeting and exceeding the requirements for marine aids to navigation to the maritime industry.

NOTE TO EDITORS

Tideland Signal recently won a contract to supply its SeaBeacon 2 System 6 dual-band racons (radar beacons) to the General Lighthouse Authorities of the UK and Ireland for a duration of three years with an option on a further year.

The contract was awarded under the terms of a joint-GLA framework agreement, which includes the Commissioners of Irish Lights (CIL) and the Northern Lighthouse Board (NLB) as well as Trinity House. Consequently, the Tideland racons will be installed not only around the coastline of England, Wales and Northern Ireland, but also the Republic of Ireland, Scotland and the Isle of Man.
